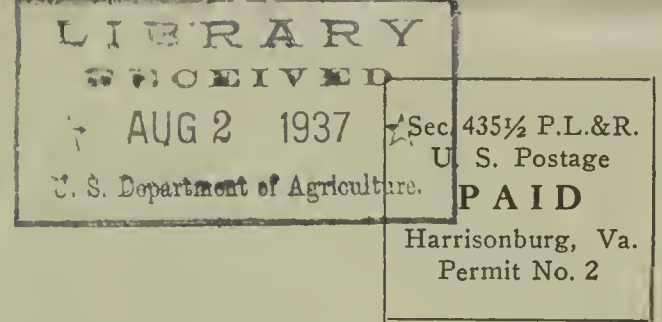

A perennial, once started will stand indefinitely—very hardy and drought resistant. Thrives on thin acid soil. Very leafy and a heavy seeder. Will make two cuttings the first year. A heavy and deep rooted system. Plant hulled seed in spring after danger of killing frost. Sow about 15 lbs. per acre broadcasted like Alfalfa. Cover about eight inches. Plant unhulled seed in Feb. and March. 20 lbs. per acre. Inoculate with NITROGEN.

Soy Beans

Culture—For hay broadcast 1½ bushels per acre; for seed 1 bushel. Cow Peas and Soy Beans should not be sown in Virginia until the latter part of May or the first of June.

Care—If a crust forms on the land before the Soy beans come up, break it up with a harrow. This will prevent what is commonly called "breaking their necks."
