Will of Dame Elizabeth Dale. Dat. 4 July, 1640, Rec.⁽¹⁾ 2 Dec. 1640. Debts to be paid out of her estate in East India Co. and in Va.; "niece M^{rs} Dorothy Throgmorton to have 500 acres in Va.;" Edward Hambye to have all her land in Charles Hundred in Va.; "her ould servant Hannah Pickering to have £100 lawful English money." Residue in two equal parts of which one she gives to the children of Sir William Throgmorton, Knight Baronet, and the other to Mr. Richard Hambye and Mr. William Crimpton; gives her nephew, the Viscount Gondamore, a Ring of tenn pds price: mentions "Richard Hambye, Mr. Richard Hambye's sone." The mark of Dame Elizabeth Dale.

"M^r Wm. Schrimpton of Whitechurch in the Co. of South: Gent and Richard Hambye of the city of Weston in the County of Midd, Gent, exors of the will of Dame Elizabeth Dale, late wife and sole ex^x of Sir Thomas Dale, knt. deced, etc." [Their deed to Samuel Chandler of London, merchant, "now bound for Virginia," dated last of August, 1641.]

being then psonally p^rte that on Sunday y^e first of y^{is} instant of nov: in y^e tyme of divine service at y^e pishe Church of St. Mary White Chappell in this County one Richd Price did after a rude irreligious and uncivil mann: intrude himselfe into y^e seate purposely designed and made use off by his Mat^s Justic^s of y^e peace for this County there beinge then psonally p^sent in y^e s^d seate two of y^e s^d Justic^s wth M^r Edward Dale high sherr: of y^{is} County whom y^e s^d Price did rudely force bacward upon his seate whilst he endeavored to keep y^e s^d Price out which behaviour of y^e s^d Price tending to y^e dishon^r of God Almighty y^e contempt of his Mat^{ie} and Mynisters offence of y^e congregation scandall to religion and evil example of others All of w^{ch} this Court taking into serious Consideracon and feareing they might bee thought ptiall (the Vindicacon of their s^d membs and sherife considered) have ordered that M^r Edward Dale doe send a messengere forthwith to y^e Right Ho^{ble} Govern^r to crave his hon^{rs} speciall warat to command y^e s^d Price psonally to appeare att y^e next Gen^l Co^rt at a day Certaine to answer y^e said Comp^lt before his hon^r and councell and it is further ordered and M^r Robert Beverley is hereby authorized and desired to psecute y^e s^d Price at y^e s^d Court.”
